The EU Emissions Trading System in shipping

The EU ETS was established in 2005. The EU ETS was the first emissions trading system in the world and remained the largest greenhouse gas emissions trading system. The aviation sector and the Industrial Plants participated in EU ETS at the early stage. On 18 December 2022, EU ETS Directive 2003/87/EC was revised to include Maritime transport in the scheme with the first reporting period in 2024. This

webinar aims to familiarize participants with EU

ETS requirements and inform them about their responsibilities.

FuelEu Maritime & contractual challenges

The presentation provides a detailed overview of the EU's FuelEU Maritime Regulation. It explores regulatory obligations, enforcement timelines, and the legal implications for stakeholders including shipowners, charterers, and bunker suppliers. The session highlights key contract tools such as the BIMCO FuelEU Clause and outlines necessary updates to bunker supply agreements.

We will look briefly on the IMO's GHG reduction measures adopted at MEPC 83, which also aim

at decarbonizing shipping through lifecyclebased emission controls.

The course is intended to provide the attendees with a basic understanding of the following topics:

- FuelEU Maritime Regulation.
- Contractual challenges/BIMCO FuelEU Clause/Bunker supply contracts.
- Brief comparison with IMO MEPC 83 interim measures, effective from 2027.
